AM AGREEMENT made the 11th day of FEBRUARY, 1933,
BETWEEN the BOOKHAMS SOCIAL SERVICE BUREAU of HIGH
STREET GREAT BOOKHAM hereinafter called the BUREAU,
on the one part, and ALFRED LONGHURST of SOLE COTTAGE,
GREAT BOOKHAM, SURREY, LANDSCAPE GARDENER, hereinafter
called the CONTRACTOR of the other part. THIS
AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that in consideration of a sum
not exceeding TWO HUNDRED POUNDS to be paid to the
CONTRACTOR by the BUREAU, the said CONTRACTOR will
execute and complete a BOWLING GREEN in GREAT BOOKHAM
RECREATION GROUND, it being understood that the full
knowledge and consent of the COMPETENT AUTHORITY,
namely, the GREAT BOOKHAM PARISH COUNCIL has already
been sought and obtained for the project.

The site for the said BOWLING GREEN is denoted in the ACCOMPANYING PLAN, which is attached to this AGREEMENT, and is signed by the PARTIES hereto and the works are further to be carried out in conformity with the CLAUSES of this AGREEMENT and the SPECIFICATION included herein.

- 1. The sum specified for payment of the works shall be EXCLUSIVE of the cost of TURVES, and the CONTRACTOR undertakes to allow a REBATE from the said sum if found possible.
- 2. THE CONTRACTOR undertakes to EMPLOY up to a total of SIXTEEN MEN on the work, weather conditions permitting for a working week of THREE DAYS PER MAN, and a working day of EIGHT HOURS PER MAN, or a total working week of TWENTY-FOUR HOURS PER MAN.

takes to pay the said WORKMEN at a rate not less than ONE SHILLING per HOUR during their period of employ.

- 4. The CONTRACTOR undertakes to COVER fully and to discharge his LIABILITIES as an EMPLOYER OF LABOUR under the NATIONAL HEALTH, NATIONAL UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCES and WORKHEN'S COMPENSATION ACTS of PARLIAMENT with regard to the said WORKMEN.
- 5. The CONTRACTOR further undertakes the cartage of the TURVES, and to supply all the necessary TOOLS and MATERIALS requisite to the satisfactory completion of the WORK by him.
- 6. The CONTRACTOR undertakes to hand over the BOWLING GREEN to the LOCAL AUTHORITY properly completed and ready for play, not LATER THAN the 5th day of JUNE, 1933.
- 7. The BUREAU will approve an AGENT, who shall at all reasonable times be permitted to inspect the WORK in progress, and the CONTRACTOR UNDERTAKES to give favourable consideration to any suggestions made to him by the said AGENT with regard thereto.
- 8. The BUREAU undertakes to make weekly payments on account of work done and material supplied, subject to maximum weekly payments of EIGHTEEN POUNDS and to an aggregate of such weekly payments amounting to ONE HUNDRED and EIGHTY POUNDS. The balance of the money shall be retained by the BUREAU pending satisfactory completion of the job and the rendering by the CONTRACTOR of a final account.
- 9. In event of any dispute arising between the said PARTIES to this AGREEMENT the matter in dispute shall be referred to the CHAIRMAN of the LEATHERHEAD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL, whose ruling shall be accented

as binding upon the PARTIES.

SPECIFICATION FOR WORKS.

- 1. Ground is to be trenched, cleaned and levelled to dimensions of shaded area in accompanying plan.
- 2. Good clean turf obtained from BOOKHAM COMMON OUTFALL WORKS is to be laid.
- 3. A 12" ditch is to be constructed around green.
- 4. The 12" ditch is to be filled with coarse clean ballast.
- 5. A wire fence is to be constructed about three sides of the green as indicated on the plan.
- 6. A live fence consisting of privet is to be planted and maintained for one year from the date of PLANTING. Any gaps due to privet not rooting to be made good by the CONTRACTOR for one year from date of PLANTING.
